Instructions for Completing the Grade 9 Course Selections

Compulsory Courses

Choose the five compulsory courses, one in each subject area (English, French, Geography, Mathematics, and Science) at either the applied or academic level. Course descriptions are in the DSBN Program & Course Calendar and in the Open House package.

Frequently Asked Questions

What is the difference between applied and academic courses?

Both contain hands-on learning experiences; however, courses at the Academic level contain more theory and require more in-depth abstract thinking skills combined with independent learning opportunities. Courses at the Applied level usually have more structured learning that includes more guidance from the teacher.

Does it matter which level I take in Grades 9 & 10?

Yes. In order to take university destination courses (beginning in Grade 11), students **must** successfully complete **Academic level courses in Grade 10**. While students should always be encouraged to reach for the best achievement possible, students, along with their parents/guardians, need to carefully consider their interests, abilities, and post-secondary goals and choose Applied or Academic levels wisely.

Is there a range of marks in Grade 8 that would indicate which level to take?

The provincial standard as set by the Ministry of Education is 70% or above. We recommend that a student achieving at this level (without modifications) with good work habits and good attendance attempt Academic courses. If a student's senior elementary grades are below 60%, a student should consider Applied courses. For students whose marks are between these two ranges, course choice is dependent upon their level of effort. Please strongly consider your Grade 8 teacher's recommendations; they are your best resource.

Can I take some courses at the Applied level and some at the Academic level?

The simple answer is yes; however, we recommend that, in most cases, you take all compulsory courses at the same level. We have found that some students might select one or two courses at the academic level because they like those subjects and do well, but select others at the applied level because they do not. Choose levels based on abilities and future directions and not simply on likes and dislikes.

Choosing Art Credits and Elective Credits

<u>Usually</u> students choose <u>one</u> Arts Credit **AND** <u>one</u> Elective Credit; however, students can choose two Arts Credits with permission. Indicate your second choice for each in case of a timetable conflict.

Healthy Active Living Credit

Indicate Male or Female for your physical education credit. If you are planning on taking Healthy Active Living in Summer School, please note that the Summer School course course and the Grade 9 course have different course codes and students **can** earn both credits. Either one will count toward their physical education compulsory credit.

Westlane Hockey Academy

Westlane offers a specialized program, second semester, where students earn two physical education credits. This option would replace the PPL credit and the Elective credit. There is an extra cost associated with this option.
