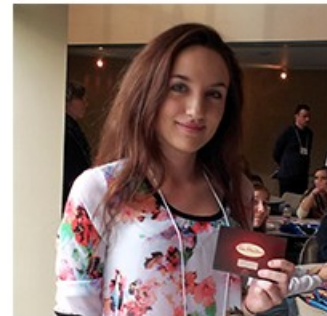
MR AINSLIE'S GRADE NINE GEOGRAPHY CLASS
