Definitions You Should Know!

Scholarship: a financial award made to support a student's education, based on academic or other achievements. Scholarships are **EARNED**

Bursary: is a financial award granted to a student on the basis of the student's **FINANCIAL NEED**

Award: a prize or other mark of a recognition given in honour of high academics or an achievement.







Entrance Scholarships



Entrance Scholarships are provided by many UNIVERSITIES

YOU must check their Websites! (or attend those virtual visits and Open Houses)

Entrance Scholarships vary from school to school and program to program

Usually based on your Grade 12 Average (top 6U/M) but some schools include program prerequisites

The higher your average the more \$\$\$ you get!



Scholarships, bursaries and grants: Scholarships are usually awarded based on academic merit or other achievements, rather than financial need. Bursaries and grants are based primarily on an individual's financial needs, but may involve other selection criteria such as extracurricular activities, community involvement and leadership. Contact your college's Financial Aid or Student Awards office to learn more about awards you may apply for through your college.

In addition to awards offered within the college system, there are many available through non-profit organizations, corporations and service clubs. The following links will help you research scholarships, bursaries and grants that you may qualify for:

Awards and bursaries

OneApp – Apply to hundreds of awards and bursaries at once

Student Awards and Financial Aid recognizes student success and provides support to those in financial need. We understand how busy the school year can be, so we have developed one application for all awards and bursaries offered at Brock. We call it OneApp.





SHSM Scholarships have deadlines too, make sure you check your intended school's website to see what you need to do:

SPECIALIST HIGH SKILLS MAJOR SCHOLARSHIP



Niagara College is offering \$1,000 academic scholarships to Specialist High Skills Major applicants who enrol directly from high school in the correct corresponding program and who confirm their offer of acceptance before May 1.

Who's eligible?

- Direct from secondary school applicants who have received, or are in the process of receiving, a Specialist High Skills Major credential.
- Eligibility is based on the average of the highest final senior level courses in required subjects as of May 1. Where the Grade 12 course is in progress, the Grade 11 final will be used.
- A minimum average of 80% in the required subjects must be maintained to receive this award.

Some programs have additional requirements. Visit your program's website for more information. Meeting minimum criteria for the scholarship *does not* necessarily guarantee entry to the program. Scholarships will be awarded based on grades and SHSM received prior to the scholarship deadline. Scholarships are applied to your Niagara account upon review of final grades and SHSM reconciliation.

Financial Aid

Ontario Student Assistance Program- "OSAP"

Grant: free money, you do not pay it back

Loan: you must pay it back with interest (*interest free when you are enrolled in school) after graduation

Schools located in smaller areas tend to cost less than schools in BIG cities





Things to Consider for OSAP



OSAP tends to give more money if you travel farther away for school.

The <u>OSAP ESTIMATOR</u> will help you plan how much you <u>might</u> receive but you will not be given an actual amount until you have paid for an acceptance to a post-secondary institution.

Westlane hosts OSAP presentations in the Spring each year, once the funding criteria are released by the Ministry. It will get posted in Google Classroom once booked.





What do you need to apply for a Scholarship (usually)?

Bursaries will need proof of Financial Need

- Transcript or Graduation Summary
- Awards
- Extra-Curricular and Volunteer Involvement (above the required amount)
- Leadership Opportunities
- Employment History
- Reference Letters
- Sometimes an essay or personal statement
- Accomplishments in any other areas



Reference Letters

Ask EARLY

Give at least two weeks notice, they take some time!

Ask a trusted and responsible adult who knows you well: Teacher, Coach, Employer, Principal (not a relative)

Provide them with:

- A Resume
- List of activities/clubs
- Details about the audience
- Your academic/program goals
- Letter of Reference Request Form



Nomination Process

Nomination

Some Scholarships/Bursaries require the school to nominate a candidate(s)- these are called Sponsored Applications ex. Schulich Scholarship.

Guidance posts information about these scholarships in the Google Classroom and asks to be notified of your interest. Depending on the response, more information may be required from you.

We then coordinate the staff selection process, and notify the sponsored candidate to complete the scholarship.



Nomination Process Continued

- Some Scholarships have a Direct Pool Application process. Students may apply on their own and the high school is not involved at all ex. Horatio Alger Canadian Scholarships
- Some Scholarships have a Sponsored Application AND a Direct Pool Application ex. Schulich Scholarship





Tips and Tricks for Scholarship and Bursary Applications

- START EARLY: some close in the fall
- Research
- Review **DEADLINES** and the process for applying
- Read the Criteria to make sure you qualify
- Neatness and clarity are ESSENTIAL
- Quality rather than quantity
- Keep a hard copy and backup copy for all applications
- Research past winners for tips on what to include in your application
